The system is used by officials and employees of the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA) in the performance of their official duties related to determining the eligibility of individuals for access to classified information, access to buildings and facilities, or to conferences over which DTRA has security responsibility.

The system includes: name, social security number, date and place of birth, citizenship, grade/rank, service, organization, security clearance-related information, vehicle ID and decal number, picture identification, correspondence concerning adjudication/passing of clearances/accesses, and it identifies security managers and personnel authorized to request area access/badge/local area network.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

The potential of mishandling privacy information is low. DTRA has a mandatory requirement tracked by the DTRA Learning Management System (LMS) for all individuals to complete Privacy Act Training. System access is monitored by system administrators and routinely checked for access requirements. All system users are required to justify their access via their supervisor and digitally sign an acknowledge statement about the sensitivity of the data to which they will have access.
