


**FISCAL YEAR 2011 REPORT OF CLOSED MEETING OF
THE THREAT REDUCTION ADVISORY COMMITTEE
UNDER SECTION 10(d) OF THE FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACT**

The Threat Reduction Advisory Committee met in closed plenary session on May 11, 2011 at the ANSER Conference Facility, Shirlington, Virginia.

The meeting was conducted in closed session because it concerned matters listed in 5 U.S.C. 552B(c)(1)(1988). Full development of the topics required discussion of information classified at the Top Secret and Secret levels. Classified and unclassified issues were so intertwined that they could not reasonably be separated without defeating the effectiveness and meaning of the overall meeting. As the TRAC Chairman, I presided over the May meeting. The Committee considers threat reduction strategies and implementation, global threat reduction prototypes, biological defense, nuclear security and weapons of mass destruction (WMD) threats. These national security issues relate to the scientific and technical aspects of overall threat reduction.

The committee received updates from the five working groups on their current state of information gathering and product development. There were no deliberations and no final recommendations were prepared for presentation to the sponsoring organization. The committee also received briefings from Mr. William Millonig of the National Counterterrorism Center and Ambassador Joseph DeTrani of the National Counterproliferation Center. Ms. Paula DeSutter provided a history and discussion of the challenges of the Libya WMD Elimination program and Mr. Andrew Weber hosted a discussion concerning the future efforts of the committee.
