- Protect the Agency, its programs, people, and infrastructure from the threat of FMI
- Emphasize positive, transparent, and factual messaging as central to all DTRA missions
- Develop and guide strategies for Agency personnel to execute the Agency's missions in an increasingly complex and hostile foreign information environment
- Maximize the positive impact of US security assistance programs in collaborative and cooperative ways
- Conduct internal training initiatives to help our workforce and our foreign partners identify foreign malign influence



## **Present and Future Requirements**

- Utilization of technology
  - Integrate information environment characterization processes
  - Ensure Agency personnel have situational awareness about the info ecosystem
  - Enhance messaging streams and content reach
- Innovation of novel approaches to preempt adversary attempts to undermine DTRA's reputation and international environments
  - Develop creative messaging pathways to enhance DTRA's messaging efforts
  - Promulgate positive sentiment about DTRA in the information environment
- Network building with relevant stakeholders in regions especially vulnerable to WMD-related FMI
  - Scientific and academic communities
  - Public health professional connectivity
- Execute external training on FMI threats and mitigation measures to partner country stakeholders
