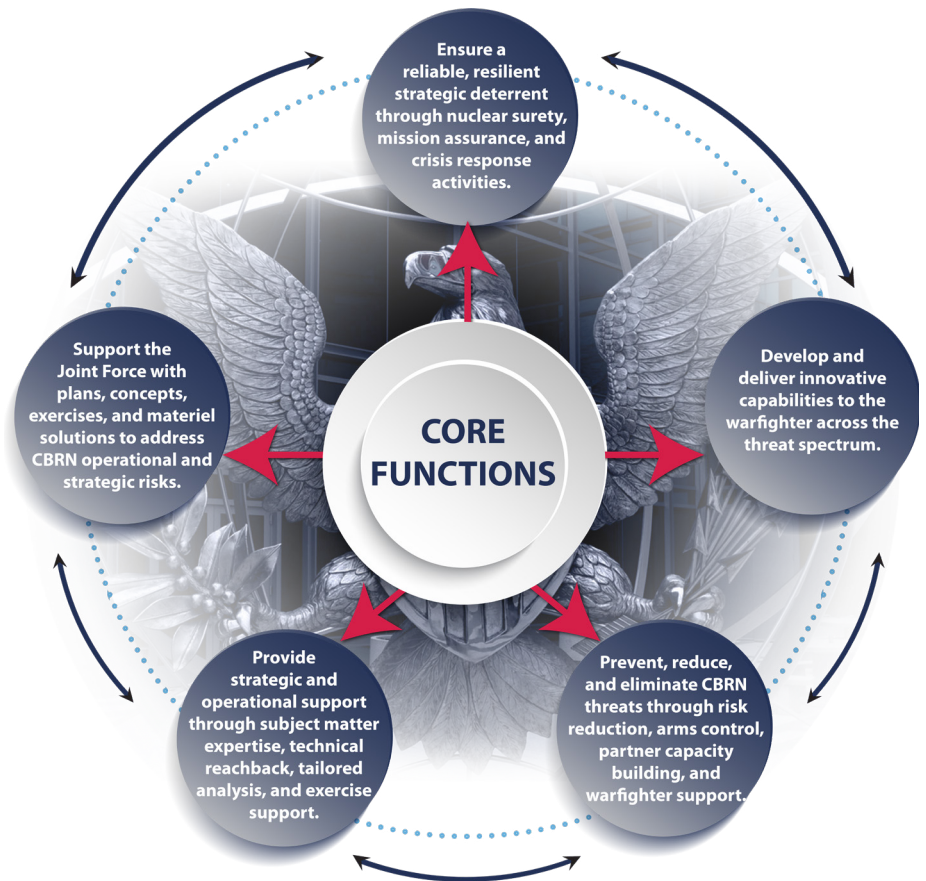
# APPROACHES
