








OB Directorate Efforts – Arms Control

- Fulfill Arms Control Obligations and Execute Treaty Rights
 - New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty (New START)
 - Treaty on Conventional Armed Forces in Europe (CFE)
 - Vienna Document 2011/Dayton Peace Accords (Dayton Agreement)
 - Chemical Weapon Destruction Monitoring (Pueblo, CO / Blue Grass, KY)



Arms Control Programs - Industry Requirements

- Arms Control Enterprise System (ACES) operations & sustainment
- Mission Support for Chemical Weapons Inspections and Destruction Monitoring at Pueblo & Blue Grass
- Interpreter Support



OB Directorate Efforts – Building Partner Capacity

- Build Partners' Counter WMD Capacity, Capability, and Political Will
 - CWMD Security Cooperation Engagement Program (CSCEP)
 - International Counterproliferation Program (ICP)
 - Proliferation Security Initiative (PSI)



BPC Programs - Industry Requirements

- SME support for CWMD programs including CBRNE handling, identification, hazard modeling/decision support, emergency response/consequence management/preparedness support, national/interagency coordination, security cooperation, countersmuggling, law enforcement
 - A&AS support services for program analysis, planning, and management support
 - Performance support for program execution/training



OB Directorate Future Requirements

- Steady-state requirements for arms control support and continually increasing demand for building partner capacity across the continuum of CWMD operations, drives an increased need for highly skilled A&AS and performer support:
 - Technical, operational, strategic
 - CBRNE, CWMD, CWMD-T, C-iWMD
 - Interagency / international coordination
 - Security cooperation
 - Information technology
 - Project / program management
