

Background

HISTORY

- To promote flexibility and responsiveness to emerging RD requirements, the Agency established competitive multiple IDIQ contracts during FY02 and FY03
 - Those IDIQs were merged into one multiple award IDIQ in FY14 and awarded on 3 Dec 2013

CWMD IDIQ SOO

Scope

• Includes performing **research**, **development**, **test and evaluation**, **procurement**, **maintenance**, **support and/or sustainment** to provide scientific and technological solutions to meet the DoD's non-proliferation, counter proliferation, and consequence management objectives. Includes support to DTRA partners and future mission scope.

Objectives

Conduct research, development, test and evaluation, procurement, maintenance, support and/or sustainment resulting in the delivery of data, hardware, software, equipment and documentation. Provides a broad spectrum of capabilities by including access to performers that may include, but not be limited to, private industry, academia, and not-for-profit / specially chartered corporations (excluding Federal Laboratories and Federally Funded Research and Development Centers).

Capability Broken into 3 Mission Pools

- 1. Artificial Intelligence (AI), Machine Learning (ML) & Data Sciences (DS)
 - Modeling and Simulation for Hazard Modeling & Force Protection
 - AI/ML/DS Tech Development & Integration
 - Data Analytics & Preparation to Support Al/ML/DS Tech Development

- 2. Detection & Countermeasures
 - WMD Physical & Medical Countermeasures
 - Systems Survivability
 - Nuclear Forensics
 - WMD Detection
 - Treaty & Verification Tech

- 3. Targeting, Information Operations & Irregular Warfare
 - CWMD Weapons & Targets
 - Information Operations/Irregular Warfare

Pool Rules

- Offerors can compete in multiple Mission Pools
 - A proposal must be submitted for each Mission Pool
 - Any Mission Pools that a contractor is awarded will be combined into one IDIQ for that particular contractor
- A prime in one Mission Pool can be a subcontractor in a different Mission Pool(s), but cannot be a subcontractor in a Mission Pool in which they are a prime.
 - A offeror can be a prime or subcontractor in multiple Mission Pools.



Pool Rules cont.

- The Government will select the appropriate Mission Pool to compete the requirement under.
 - The Task/Delivery Order Request for Proposal (TORFP) will then be sent only to the IDIQ holders within that Mission Pool.
 - It is the Government's intent that each task order will be competed under only one Mission Pool, however, the Government reserves the right to compete a task order under multiple Mission Pools.
- The Government is considering setting aside Mission Pool 1 and/or Mission Pool 3 for Small Business.



Evaluation Factors & Highlights

- Factor 1 Mission Capability
 - Sub Factor A Technical Approach
 - Includes Innovation and Technology Scouting
 - Sub Factor B Sample Task Order
 - Will be included in final RFP
 - Will have a separate Task Order for each Pool (Pool specific Task Order)
 - Sub Factor C Management Approach
- Factor 2 Past Performance
 - Focused on the ability to bring to together large, complex teams to deliver a product
- Factor 3 Socioeconomic Commitment
 - Sub Factor A Small Business Participation
 - Will be based off the Sample Task Order
 - Sub Factor B Small Business Subcontracting Performance
- Factor 4 Cost
 - Evaluated for the Sample Task Order



Notes on Proposal Submission

- A Small Business subcontract plan is not required with proposal, but acceptable plan must be submitted prior to award.
 - The KO reserves the right to request a subcontracting plan within the Task Orders
- The Organizational Conflict of Interest (OCI) mitigation plan must be submitted with the proposal and will addresses internal processes and procedures for identifying, evaluating and resolving potential, real and apparent OCIs at the Task Order level
 - Supplemental mitigation plans may be negotiated for individual orders, depending on the requirement
