Deputy Director, Nuclear Enterprise Directorate



Marc Franciszkowicz, a member of the Senior Executive Service (SES), serves as the Deputy Director, Nuclear Enterprise, for the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA). In his role as Deputy Director, he leads a team that establishes a holistic approach to operational and strategic matters related to the Nation's nuclear deterrent in areas of nuclear weapons safety, security, accountability, reliability and inspection; enabling solutions and DoD responses to nuclear matters and NATO partners.

Mr. Franciszkowicz was promoted to SES following 23 years in uniformed service, Industry and in the Department of Defense. He has held numerous positions within DTRA supporting: the Research and Development Directorate where he was responsible for researching, developing and testing radiation detectors and related technologies for radiological/nuclear counterproliferation and combatting terrorism; the Operations Directorate where he supervised the coordination, planning, and execution of CBRN preparedness training and exchanges; and as the Military Assistant to the DTRA Director. Aside from his positions with DTRA, he worked at the National Nuclear Security Administration and Industry providing subject matter expertise in support to the nuclear enterprise.

Mr. Franciszkowicz holds a Master of Science in Chemical Engineering from Stanford University, a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry and Life Science from the United States Military Academy, and a Graduate Certificate in Nuclear Weapons Effects, Policy and Proliferation from the Air Force Institute of Technology. He was part of the faculty at the United States Military Academy as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry where he published and presented research on incorporating technology in the classroom.
