

# BG David Warshaw

## Director of Operational Analysis



U.S. Army Brig. Gen. David Warshaw is the Director of the Operational Analysis Department, Operations and Integration Directorate (OI-OA) for the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA). In this capacity, he provides analytic situational awareness and understanding to the DTRA Director, Directorates, and staff for weapons of mass destruction (WMD) and improvised threats and associated networks against the National Defense Strategy (NDS) framework; provides counter-threat network (CTN) analysis in support of Combatant Commands (CCMDs) and deployed forces to enable operations against enemy networks; and identifies operational solutions to counter WMD and improvised threat activities in coordination with DTRA's Research & Development (RD) Directorate.

General Warshaw was commissioned in Military Intelligence upon graduation from the United States Military Academy in 1989. He has over 30 years of military intelligence and civil affairs experience. He has commanded military intelligence units at the company, battalion, and brigade levels. He has served at numerous posts in the United States as well as tours in Germany, Afghanistan, and the Horn of Africa. In his most recent assignment, he served as Commander, United States Army Reserve Element, United States Central Command J2 Headquarters in Tampa, Florida where he provided trained and ready operational intelligence personnel to combatant commanders.

General Warshaw holds a Bachelor of Science from the United States Military Academy and a Master of Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College. He also completed the Joint Forces Staff College's Joint and Combined Warfighting School-Hybrid. General Warshaw is a Joint Qualified Officer.

His awards and decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal (with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Army Achievement Medal, the Humanitarian Service Medal, the Combat Action Badge, the Senior Parachutist Badge, and the German Parachutist Badge in Bronze.
